BACKGROUND: Greers Ferry Lake is located on the Little Red River in Cleburne and Van Buren Counties, Heber Springs, Arkansas. Greers Ferry is one of the five multiple purpose projects in the White River Basin and was constructed for the generation of hydropower and flood damage reduction. The project contains two 48,000 kW hydropower generating units.

STATUS: Current work includes scheduled routine operation and maintenance activities.

SCHEDULE:

FY 2012 Scheduled Work: Funds in the amount of \$5,542,000 are being used for scheduled operation and maintenance activities.

FY 2013 Budget: Funds included in the President's FY 2013 budget in the amount of \$6,444,000 will be used for scheduled operation (\$5,377,000) and maintenance (\$1,067,000) activities. Additional funds could be used to implement shore line management plan (\$154,000), initiate master plan update (\$900,000), replace failed piezometer tubes (\$105,000), rehab/paint tainter gates and replace side seals (\$5,000,000), foundation core and stability analysis (\$100,000), repair and replacement of chains (\$1,400,000), modernization of Choctaw, Heber Springs, and Old Highway 25 parks (\$3,500,000), separate day use and camping in Heber Springs, Old Highway 25, Devils Fork and Shiloh parks (\$630,000), and prepare new water supply allocation report (\$100,000), for a total capability of \$18,333,000.
