BACKGROUND: Heyburn Lake is located at River 48.6 on Polecat Creek, a tributary of the Arkansas River, about 11 miles southwest of Sapulpa in Creek County, Oklahoma, and 2 miles upstream from U.S. Highway 66 between Sapulpa and Oklahoma City. The dam is a rolled earth-filled structure 2920 feet long. The spillway is an uncontrolled, unpaved structure located in a low natural saddle about 1000 feet west of the right abutment. At conservation pool the lake covers 877 acres.

STATUS: FY 2011 activities included routine scheduled operations and maintenance activities at the project. There were no major maintenance contracts awarded at Heyburn Lake in FY 2011.
